A HOUSING FIRST STRATEGY

The Kamloops Homelessness Action Plan is a **Housing First** Strategy. A **Housing First** approach recognizes housing as a primary human need, and places permanent housing at the top of the list of priorities. Providing permanent housing can make it easier for people to find solutions to the ongoing stresses of homelessness, poverty, addictions, mental health, and abuse. While there will remain a necessity for shelter and transitional housing for individuals requiring supports, the housing first strategy recognizes that more long term solutions must be developed.

OUTREACH UNITED

The success of action plans in cities such as Toronto, Calgary and Vancouver have been dependent upon the development of individual solutions for the people who are hardest to house. Individual solutions for individual people can only be developed through relationship building on a one-on-one basis. These individual relationships are often instigated by **outreach workers** who find the homeless where they live, in the streets. We are happy to say that Kamloops' agencies with **outreach** have begun to meet weekly to share information that helps find one-size-fits-one solutions for the homeless and at-risk of homelessness in our community. We would like to thank the members of **Community Living BC**, **Interior Health**, & **ASK Wellness** who have been instrumental in the creation of this group. Please contact the HAP if your agency would like to send a representative to this meeting.

LOCAL HOUSING BOARD

Starting in January 2011 the HAP will begin information sessions with a **Local Housing Board Working Group** to begin to define a path to affordable housing in our community. The role of the **Local Housing Board** will also be partially defined with input from the Homelessness Action Plan Leadership Council and we would like to thank them all for dedicating their valuable time to the initiative.
